President's Report ASRA 2011

2011 has been an interesting year, starting with the Air Provincials in Vermilion Alberta. As you may know, the air gun provincials have been a joint event with AHA and hosted in different communities each year. The hope was to create interest in the air gun sports. Vermilion College was a good venue and well enough attended however I think we have been missing opportunities by not having pre-event matches in the host communities. I also believe that there should be a fun event for interested local folks to bring there own air guns and under supervision ,try shooting during our open practice time.

At the 2011 AGM ASRA passed a motion requiring athletes planning to apply for the High Performance Grant to submit an "Annual Training Plan" by March 31. The intent was to ensure that the athlete was in a training program with parameters and goals focused on national level excellence.

The season continued with our CWG Team competing in Halifax, and by all accounts representing Alberta proudly. Three of the team members will still be eligible for the next games ,but there are already athletes in the wings training to challenge for a spot on the next team.

In May and June ASRA hosted 2 officials training sessions and have aquired several officials of provincial ability and one with nationals experience. This will work well with the Canadian Sport for life plan that suggests that officials should be at a level of training equal to the athlete's stage of development.

I did not attend the smallbore provincials and will let the match director expand on that event as well as the other smallbore events in 2011.

We received a \$1200 donation from the Alberta Arms and Cartridge collectors assoc. for the purchase of new air rifle provincial trophies. It was necessary to create awards that could be distributed to athletes on age categories (sub-junior, junior...) because the existing ability class trophies were inadequate and athletes are able to compete in their age category **or** classifications.

In August we hosted a 4 day camp for 6 air rifle athletes and 6 air pistol athletes, at the Narrow Lake conservation camp near Athabasca. The weather was perfect, the facility was well suited and I believe that the athletes had a grand time. The camp was supported by year 1 CWG funds from AFSS, athlete entries and a small amount each from ASRA and AHA.

The grant forms were sent to eligible athletes and completed forms were received by November 12th. All forms were sent to AFSS on November 26. The grants have not been awarded at this time because the amount that ASRA will receive for distribution is still being negotiated.

ASRA volunteers worked at the AFSS Casino event in Edmonton in November, and thanks to Janet, Brian, Wynn and Tracy the association will hopefully have an additional pot of loot to access for programs.

This is my last report as president, or from whatever position I now hold, so I just want to say, it's been a slice but it is time for someone else to lead the charge, as I am no longer able to commit the effort needed. Thank You for your support. Straight Shooting!

Subject: Motion Induced Blindness

Absolutely phenomenal!!!

This is frightening! It works exactly like it says, and is one major reason people in cars can look right at a motorcycle or bicycle and not see it. For those of us who ride/rode this is worth knowing. We have always been dumbfounded by drivers who say, after running us down, "Sorry, I did not see you". We have wondered, how can that be? I have been the victim of this phenomenon. The conclusion to be drawn from this is that car drivers become mesmerized with what they are focused on and oblivious to all else. The eye-brain connection can actually filter out peripheral information even though it is still physically and obviously right there in front of us to be seen. For motorcycle and bicycle riders this is worth knowing because knowing that this is a real neurological malfunction helps us to understand the danger that surrounds us. Watch this little film clip to see how mesmerization can affect your vision: The dots are always there, your brain just eliminates them periodically.

From a former Naval Aviator.

This is a great illustration of what we were taught about scanning outside the cockpit when I went through training back in the '50s. We were told to scan the horizon for a short distance, stop momentarily, and repeat the process. I can remember being told why this was the most effective technique to locate other aircraft. It was emphasized (repeatedly) to NOT fix your gaze for more than a couple of seconds on any single object.

The instructors, some of whom were WWII veterans with years of experience, instructed us to continually "keep our eyes moving and our head on a swivel" because this was the best way to survive, not only in combat, but from peacetime hazards (like a midair collision) as well. We basically had to take the advice on faith (until we could experience for ourselves) because the technology to demonstrate it didn't exist at that time.

Grant money

Similar to last year, in order to qualify for an High Performance Grant for 2012 shooting expenses ASRA requires that you follow the process set out below. The deadline is April 12, 2012. But first, some more information about the HP Grant.

ASRA receives an annual HP grant from AFSS, who receives their funding from the Alberta Sport, Recreation, Parks and Wildlife Foundation. This grant is meant to help out athletes who are working towards national team membership and international competitiveness. For some of you that may be part of your 2012 goal and for others it may be a goal in the near future. Juniors may show goals that show commitment to a training regime that will lead them someday to national levels of success (i.e., 2015 Canada Winter Games). Athletes will be asked to submit receipts in the late fall of 2012; receipts include travel (gas costs not mileage), equipment, and match registrations.

Process/check list for competitive athletes.

- 1. The athlete must be a member in good standing with ASRA (i.e., 2012 registration paid)
- 2. The athlete must reside in Alberta
- 3. With your coach and or parent create an annual training plan including goals
- a. What matches will you attend? Check www.absbrifle.ca for match location and dates.
- b. Include your training schedule both monthly and weekly?
- c. Include other ways you are physically active (either off season or during the shooting season)
